**Extension activity: Savali Visit.**

**Date: September 3, 2019.**

### 1.1 Introduction

The Department of English visited Sawali, an NGO located in Kedgaon, Ahmednagar, on September 3, 2019. #### 1.1.1 Duration:

#### 1.1.2 Chief Guest
