What is the plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and what is the outcome by the end of the year?

**PLAN OF ACTION CHALKED OUT, IN THE BEGINNING
OF THE YEAR TOWARDS QUALITY ENHANCEMENT.**

The Peer Team constituted by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Bangalore, visited the College in the academic year 2003-2004. The College was accredited at the 'A' level.

However, the Peer Team made various suggestions to ensure sustained development and advancement of the College.

The IQAC's plan of action for the year basically included steps to implement the suggestions given by the NAAC Peer team, which would lead to quality enhancement.

OUTCOME BY THE END OF THE YEAR

1) Teaching / Learning: -

Appointments of additional teachers: -

The College has appointed ten teachers on grantable basis in addition to appointing 22 teachers on non-grantable and 3 CHB teachers.

Senior teachers have been encouraged to engage the classes at F.Y. and S.Y. level as suggested by the Peer team.

2) Research centres: -

The College has send the application to the University of Pune for research centres in the Department of Commerce, Marathi, Physics and Geography. The College already has a research centre for Zoology.

3) Library: -

Additional 2268 books 08 Journals and periodicals have been added to the library in order to provide better learning resources to students and teachers.

The library roofing has been renovated.

A spacious State – of – the – art conference hall has been setup, which is well equipped and has a total seating capacity of 300 delegates.

4) Introduction of new courses: -

The subject of ‘Environmental Awareness’ which is very relevant in the current times has been introduced at the S.Y. level for all the three faculties viz. Arts, Commerce and Science.

5) Students feedback mechanism: -

A separate committee consisting of the Head of the departments has been formed to collect and analysis the students feedback / evaluation of teachers. The feedback is collected in an objective manner, and the results have been communicated to the concerned teachers so as to improve the quality of teaching.

6) Mobilization of financial resources: -

The U.G.C. has sanctioned ‘Instrumentation Maintenance Facility’ (IMF) and approved a grant of Rs. 3.71 lakhs to the College.

7) Non teaching staff: -

A new Registrar was appointed during the year. Several vacant posts in the office have been filled up by promotion after follow-up and getting necessary permissions from The Director of Education, Pune.

8) NCC: -

The College, already has a boys NCC wing. During the year, steps were taken to set up a Girls NCC wing and 13 girls were enrolled as cadets.

9) Providing support services: -

Support services like public telephones and Xerox facilities have been made available on the campus for the benefit of the student community.

It is expected that the above steps taken will help in quality enhancement and in implementing the suggestions given by the Peer team visit.

PART – B:

1. Activities reflecting the goal and objectives of the institution:

Some of the activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution include: -

a) Inclusive admission policy: -

Out of the total admission of 3384 students for both UG and PG classes, 1207 were girls i.e. about 36% out of the total; 348 students were from out of state and the rest from within the state. About 650 are from the minority class including 351 from Christian minority. (The College is a Christian Minority Institution) A large number of students are admitted from the North-east states of India.

b) Making available Scholarship to the Financially Weaker Students: -

The College made Government Scholarship available to almost 1726 students i.e. 51% of the total intake of students. This included scholarship to various

categories like Primary teachers wards, serving persons wards, backward class national open scholarship, physically handicapped scholarship, secondary teachers wards etc.

c) Providing Hostel facilities: -

The College has 4 Boys hostel and 4 Girls hostel and provided its facility to almost 20% of the total students. These facilities are provided to the needy specially from the rural areas and out of state students.

d) Encouragement to knowledge enhancement: -

The faculty members are encouraged to participate in various seminars, workshop, symposium etc.

During the year 52 faculty members attended various such seminars and workshops. In addition to this about 16 seminars and workshops were conducted by the different departments of the College. Also one symposium was conducted by the College during the year.

e) Various programmes for all round development of the students: -

Through the various associations set up in the College, various activities were conducted for and with the help of students, which would help in the over-all development of the students.

35. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling unit: -

The guidance and counseling unit organized guidance classes throughout the year for UPSC, MPSC examinations.

The unit also carried out three mock interview sessions.

36. Placement services provided to students: -

Campus interviews at a formal level were organized for the students of Biochemistry, Drug Chemistry and Computer Science courses.

37. Development programme for non-teaching staff: -

A seminar was organized by the College for Lab. Attendants and lab. Assistants for quality enhancement and proper handling of equipments.

38. Any other relevant information the College wishes to add: -

1. Rev. J. Barnabas, Ex-Principal and current Secretary of the B.P.H.E.Society which runs the college and other institutes received “Life Time Achievement Award” for the University of Pune.
2. Dr. Arun Nigvekar, Chairman, UGC visited the College. He also presented a ‘Manpatra’ to Rev. Dr. J. Barnabas.
3. NSS-TOC: The college has a training and orientation centre for NSS Officers of different colleges from different universities. During the year five orientation courses and three refresher courses were conducted for the NSS programme officers.

4. YCMOU: The college has a Yeshwantrao Chavan Mukta Open University Centre. During the year 136 students were enrolled for B.A. and B.Com. courses. The centre also conducts a course in Journalism in which 36 students were enrolled during the year.
5. The English department conducted a remedial English speaking course for the BA English special students.
6. The Biotechnology Department managed to have job training for S.Y. and T.Y. students at prestigious laboratories and companies like: BIAF; MPAU; NCL and University of Pune.
7. The College has four boys and four girls hostels. A substantial number of students reside in the hostels. The college has five mess facilities, bookshop, grievance cell and first aid room for the resident students. A substantial number of resident students are from the northeast states of India. During the year, renovation was carried out for one of the hostels.
8. The college has various associations / club/ cells for the benefit of the students. This include Science Club, Commerce Association, Sahitya Sadhana, English literacy association,
