2. Outcome by the end of the year

1. Introduction of New Courses

During the year 2009-2010, the following courses were successfully continued: Diploma in Hindi Translation, Certificate Course in Advanced C+. A Course in BPO Skills was started from June 2009. A career oriented course, “Advance Diploma in Modern Instrumentation” has commenced from this year. Final sanction to start certificates courses in Mushroom Cultivation and Banking from UGC is still awaited.

During the year 2009-10 three postgraduate courses were started including MCom (IT), MCA in Commerce and MCom (Business Administration). Final sanction to start MSc in Biotechnology from the Maharashtra Government is awaited.

2. Follow up on research centers

The Local Inquiry Committees (LIC) constituted by the University of Pune visited the Chemistry Department and granted permission for the continuation of the research centre in Chemistry. The University Local Inquiry Committee is expected to visit the Physics department. Follow up efforts have been continued to obtain permission to start a research centre in Botany.

3. Infrastructural Development

During the academic year the College has added the following infrastructure:

1. New Research Lab in Chemistry
2. New Research Lab for Biological Rhythm Research
3. Class Room for BBA
4. Research Lab and PG Classroom for Botany Department
5. Renovation of Boys Common Room
6. Renovation of History, Marathi, Hindi, Politics Departments and the Examination Control Room
7. Separate Research Centre for Geography

The College has continued its efforts to obtain the necessary permissions and grants to build an amphi-theatre.

4. Library

A networked centre with internet facility has been set up in the Library for staff and students. Additional research journals in various subjects have been subscribed. Renovation work has been carried out in the Main and Ladies reading rooms as well as in the Rare books and archives room.

5. Instrumentation facility

Work on starting a hobby centre in entertainment electronics is going on. The College hopes to complete the necessary set up in the next academic year.

6. Grants under FIST

Utilization of the first installment of the DST-FIST grants has been submitted to DST by the Department of Chemistry. Second installment is awaited.

Utilization of the second installment of the DST-FIST grants has been submitted by Departments of Physics and Zoology and the third installment is awaited.

New proposals for grants under DST-FIST program for Non-grant departments of Botany, Geography and Microbiology has been submitted to the DST.

7. a) The last installment of the UGC grant for building the ladies hostel has been received. University committee visited the College to review the progress in the construction of the ladies hostel.
- b) Efforts are on to obtain permission from the Maharashtra government to start M.Sc. in Biotechnology.

8. Computer Network Centers:

Internet connectivity has been provided to the Social Science and Art Departments.

9. Office Automation:

- a. Installation of Tally software.
- b. Upgradation of existing software is in process.

10. College Website:

Improvements have been made in the website of the College by adding more content and facilities.

12. Renovation and Upgradation:

- a) Generator back up has been provided to the departments of Zoology and Chemistry.
- b) Chemistry laboratory has been renovated.
- c) Electrification of classrooms has been completed.
- d) Classrooms of BCA, BCS and MSC in Computer Science department and Electronics Laboratory have been renovated.

PART – B

1. Activities reflecting the goal and objectives of the institution: Some of the activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution include: -

1. Research work in the College:

The College believes that core research is an important step towards quality in education. The College currently has 23 Ph.D. and M.Phil guides, 67 students have registered for Ph.D. and M.Phil.

2. Introduction of new courses:

Short term courses fulfilling the current needs of the students and the local community are continued: Diploma in Hindi Translation, Certificate Course in Advanced C+. A Certificate Course in BPO Skills commenced in June 2009. Advance Diploma in Medical Instrumentation commence in September 2009. Postgraduate courses in MCom (IT), MCom (Business Administration) and MCA in Commerce have commenced from this year.

3. Hostel facilities:

The construction of the new ladies hostel is near completion. The College men and women's hostels now accommodate 400 male and 310 female students.

4. Other activities:

The inclusive admission policy of the College encourages girls, minorities, and out of state students to join our institution. During the year the College of the total number of students in the College, 13.5% students were from SC category, 0.2% from ST category, 7.1% from OBC category, 33.4% women, and 0.3% were disabled students. - b. Mrs. V.V. Mahendru and Dr. S.R. Bale attended a One-day Re-orientation Workshop' on teaching revised syllabi in Botany at Department of Botany, University of Pune, 2009.
- c. The department of Botany organized a one-day district level workshop sponsored by BCUD, University of Pune on "SYBSc Practicals" in January 2010.
- d. Department of Physics organized a district level one-day workshop on "Phoenix" pertaining to the TYBSc Physics practicals for College teachers from Physics and Electronic subjects in January 2010.
- e. Dr. Talule D C participated in a one-day workshop on framing the TYBA syllabus.

7. Inter-disciplinary programmes started:

- a. Physics: Staff members are contributing at BSc Biotechnology. The Computer laboratory and instrumentation laboratory are used by students of Chemistry, Zoology, Biotechnology along with those of Physics.
- b. Department of Mathematics: Staff members are involved in the teaching of B.Sc. Biotech and B. Com courses and vocational Biotech courses.
- c. Department of Zoology: Collaboration with the University of Regensbergh, Germany for exchange programme of students and scholars in Chronobiology has continued.
- d. Department of Botany: Contributory teaching at B.Sc. Biotech courses and vocational Biotech courses.

B.A. and B.Com. undergraduate level a term end examination of 20 marks was conducted and the final examination was of 80 marks conducted by the University of Pune. Postgraduate courses have semester examinations which include internal assessment for 20 marks.
